ST MATTHEW'S FINANCING

St Matthew's Half Year Finances

In preparing the 2016 budget, the Finance Committee projected a deficit of £8770. Half year figures to 30th June show that both income and expenditure are roughly on line with budget with a projected deficit of around £7000. This would mean that at 31st December 2016 our totally free reserves would be almost completely used. Meanwhile we are still 10% (£7000) short on pledges to cover the Children and Families Worker 3-vear extension funding requirements. Although it is anticipated that only £13000 will be required of the Designated Fund of £20000 which has been set aside to cover the current CFW contract uncovered costs, it would be a great encouragement if the remaining £7000 could be released to cover this year's projected general income and expenditure deficit. Please consider prayerfully whether you are able to assist by increasing vour general level of giving. or, if you have not already done so, by completing a pledge for the CFW renewal fund.



FIT FOR THE FUTURE

As part of our mission to Grow God's Church, wider, deeper and closer, St Matthew's PCC have been progressing plans to make the church building more flexible, comfortable and accessible. Following the consultation in November, and the Day of Prayer and the discussion at the APCM in April, the PCC have been researching the options for an upgraded heating system and new seating.

The decision has now been taken to replace the existing high-level radiant heaters with wall-based electric radiators. This system should provide a much more comfortable environment than the current system, with lower hourly running costs. With increasing use of the church building, it should even 'pay for itself'. An electric system would be more flexible, easier and cheaper to install, and less visually intrusive than a gas-fired system, which was the main alternative.

A working group have carefully considered various chairs to replace the pews in the main body of the church, taking account of things such as comfort, stackability, and durability. The recommendation, accepted by PCC, is for a chair called 'Abbey', widely used in churches and cathedrals, and for the whole floor to be covered with a carpet of a similar type and quality to the present one.

The next steps are to develop these plans, consulting with the Church Architect, Diocesan authorities and historic societies, and consider fund-raising possibilities. The estimated total cost of an upgraded heating system, new seating and carpeting is around £90,000, and much of this could be covered from existing reserves. Quotes will be sought in the autumn, and permissions in the spring, with a view to all the work being done in the summer/early autumn of 2017.
