Retired Archbishop Henry Orombi, went on to say, we should be fit, ready for action, have our equipment (armour) in good working order, know who your enemy is and be prepared to jump over every obstacle put in your way.



This was a good challenge to us as we begin this New Year.

We are amazed how God is spurring us on to be more involved with young people and to respond to local needs with appropriate action.

It has been a concern of David's that many young people do not want to be involved with farming. They want an education in order to get an office job and leave the land. This year he wants to inspire some young men and women how essential and valuable farming is to the nation of Uganda. He has been invited to start a young farmers club at one of the primary schools, and have lessons as well as demonstrations for the young people



It has been on Heather's heart for some time the plight of young girls in the community, many of them are getting pregnant before they are 14 years of age. This year the health and women's department are working together to start a "Daughters of the King" programme for teenage girls. This will be a discipleship and life skills programme. They are writing the curriculum at present and will launch the programme in March in 4 parishes.

Many of the people who were evacuated from South Sudan over Christmas have gone to Kampala and some are preparing to return to South Sudan. Keep praying for peace and stability in this young country. Praise Jesus we were able to give them support and hospitality over this period of insecurity for them.
