CHILTON HAND RAIL UPDATE

After considering valuable feedback in connection with the proposed Chancel handrail, the following changes are envisaged, subject to DAC approval.

1. Looking towards the altar from the nave, the hand rail to now be positioned on the right hand wall instead of on the left.

2. In the revised position, the rail can project into the nave by about 250mm, to give better support when coming down the step.

3. The rail will be horizontal at 950mm from the ground except for the end section over the step which will slope down to 900mm.

4. Once the handrail has been crafted by the forge and fitted by them, a wooden top will be crafted similar to that on the communion rail. This will allow for easier grip and hopefully be made of elm to match the pews and new credence table.

5. To allow for clear access, prior to communion the lectern will be moved about 500mm towards the war memorial and repositioned after the service.

MEN IN SUDAN

Reverend Hassan Abduraheem, Mr Petr Jašek and Mr Abdumonem Abdumawla have been found guilty of a number of charges, including espionage, a national security crime. Czech national Mr Jašek was found guilty of espionage and sentenced to life imprisonment. Reverend Abduraheem and Mr Abdumawla were found guilty of espionage and abatement and sentenced to ten years imprisonment. They can launch an appeal in the next 15 days, and the pastors' lawyers intend to do this. Please pray for this appeal and the release of these men. For more information see HCChurches.org/news
