

CHARITY MARKET STALL


Held in the car park of the Rose and Crown between 9 am and 12 noon every second Saturday of the month.

INTERVIEW WITH JOHN & CAROL PIGOTT

John and Carol celebrated their 50th Wedding Anniversary in March this year,

(congratulations!) and decided to have a few trips away this year to celebrate. In March they went into London to see The Mousetrap and they are going on a cruise with their children and grandchildren in December to celebrate Christmas in the Canary Islands.

So did they always have exotic holidays? No, when they were younger they both used to visit family members. John had an uncle with a smallholding so always used to visit there with this family in the summer. John and Carol got married in 1967 and went to Jersey for their honeymoon which was very special. John in particular wasn't keen to travel abroad as he didn't want to

worry about speaking another language.

When their children Bryan, Stephanie and Andrew were young, Carol and John bought a tent and they had some camping holidays in the UK. They also enjoyed some narrowboat holidays. One of these holidays was terrible. It was over the Harvest weekend and there were 7 of them on board. The shower was located in the middle of the boat – so when someone was showering you couldn't get from one end of the boat to the other, unless you went over the top of the boat. The sink was the smallest sink that they had ever seen! About 7 inches across. They had a dog that was running alongside the path trying to get on board at one point, and then they spilt some whiskey into the carpet covered floor. But worst of all was the toilet, which became so full that they had to use the local pubs,

and remember ending their holiday with some of them running ahead to the boat house in order to use the loo! Not a good experience!

In 1992 John retired from working at Didcot Power Station and they decided to travel over to America to visit John's sister Jean who had been living there for many years. John was

pleased to find that you could go abroad and not have to worry about any language issues! And driving on the right hand side of the road wasn't so bad either. They had a lovely time with lean and her husband Ted.

In 1995 they had some money from an insurance policy and decided to have a holiday of a lifetime and went on a cruise on Canberra. This was one of
