

## ALL SOULS' SERVICE

As we move into the autumn, we are rapidly approaching a season of remembrance. We are all aware of Remembrance Sunday when we honour the memory of those who have served our country in the armed services during war, as well as remembering and praying for those who continue to suffer as a result of violent conflict. This year our Remembrance Services will take place on Sunday 12 November (9.30am at All Saints' Chilton and 11am at St Matthew's Harwell).

But there is also an opportunity to remember members of our own families, members of our own communities, or friends who have died. These remembrances are the focus of All Souls' Day which is marked in the church calendar on **2 November** (the day after the better known All Saints' Day). In our main morning services on **Sunday 5 November** we are going to remember and give thanks to God for loved ones who have died in an 'All Souls Service' at 9.30am at Chilton and 11am at Harwell. We will reflect on what these dear ones meant to us and also be reminded of the Christian hope of the resurrection for all those who believe and trust in Jesus Christ.

In advance of the services on **5 November**, we will be writing to the families of those whose funerals we have conducted in the past 3 years. However, many of us will have lost loved ones more than 3 years ago, or we will have family and friends who have died but who didn't live in Harwell or Chilton. We would love to welcome you to these services, too, so please come, whether you receive a letter of invitation or not. And please pass on the date to others who you think might like to know about the All Souls' services.

### PEWS FOR SALE



You may know that we are in the process of asking permission from the church authorities to dispose of our pews in favour of more flexible, comfortable and practical seating. They are heritage ornaments which we want to go to a good home if we are allowed to remove them. We do hope that that permission will come soon and so are now taking reservations up to 15 October. When we have disposed of a few pews before, they have been given a new lease of life as elegant additions to homes but also, with treatment, in gardens.

At the time of writing, we have at least 20 pitch pine or deal pews of varying lengths to rehome. The prices will be:

short (H 103 x W 147 x D 63) - £75 ono; medium (H 103 x W 250 x D 63) - £100; and long (H 103 x W 310 x D 63) - £125. You can view the pews in St Matthew's from 9am-3pm until 30th September, or by appointment from 4.30-6.30pm.

Assuming we are allowed to sell the pews, we will ask you to take away the one(s) you've bought away as soon as they are finally unfixed from the floor. This could be any time between mid-October and late November, and we may be able to give you only a few days' notice. One thing to consider then is that, if you reserve a pew but have a holiday booked (for example), you organise for a friend or neighbour to come down to claim it on your behalf.

### RECTOR'S LETTER

This month's letter is an update on St Matthew's re-ordering plans. Whilst of greatest interest to the Harwell readership, many people in Chilton might be interested to know what is going on down the road in the sister church.

### What's this all about?

You will hopefully recall that, following consultation, St Matthew's have committed to making the church building more flexible, accessible and comfortable by replacing the fixed pews with chairs and installing a new heating system. The plans also involve some minor levelling of the floor and laying a new carpet. We are also planning to redecorate the nave (the main seating area), which is a major project involving scaffolding.

### So how far have we got?

We already have permission and funding for the redecoration, and are in the final stages of seeking formal approval for the seating/flooring project. We are doing some extra work on the heating plans before formally seeking approval to proceed with this. We have identified some - but not all - of the funding for the heating/seating/flooring project.

### What is the timescale?

We have committed to the redecoration work between 25th September and 3rd November, during which time the church will not be open to the public. During October the 11am services (1st to 29th inclusive) will not be held in church, and will instead be held in Harwell Village Hall (please bring your own bibles!). We hope still to be able to use the chancel for the 8am and evening services, however. (During this period, post for the office can be delivered to the Rectory).

We hope to do the seating/flooring work during November, if we are granted permission in time and contractors can be lined up, but this is currently uncertain. Alternatively this could be done in the New Year. This work should hopefully not disrupt our regular pattern of services and other activities. The heating aspect of the project would not happen until early 2018.

### How can I get involved?

- Firstly, please *pray for the project*, for permissions and funding, and that it would help our mission to Grow God's Church, wider, deeper and closer.
- Secondly, please consider whether you might be able to *make a financial gift* towards the seating, the heating, or both, and whether you might like to donate a chair/chairs in memory of a loved one (see link below or call the Church Office).
- Thirdly, please consider whether you might like to *buy a pew*. Some are already spoken for, but there are still some available. There is more information about this on the previous page.

### FRANCES GEERING ALMSHOUSES, HARWELL

The Almshouses have been an important feature of Harwell High Street and a fascinating part of our village history since the late 1730s. They were originally built due to a remarkable benefactress called Frances

Jennings who decided to fight for her rights in a man's world. She had been born to a wealthy Harwell family and when she married at the age of 61, she realised that all her assets would become the legal property of her new husband William Geering. Frances therefore took steps

to protect her considerable personal estate. A prenuptial agreement was very unusual in those days but she had an indenture drawn up in 1715 which stated that her assets should be kept "in trust for me and to my sole and separate use and... the said William Geering... should not intermeddle... therewith." Thus on her death in 1731 she was able, by her will made in 1723, to bequeath £1200 (over a million pounds today) to be used for building Almshouses in Harwell village.

The houses were built originally for 6 widows to live in, and 4 trustees were appointed to administer the charity. There was a real need for this type of accommodation as houses were often tied to a job and a family would often be made homeless. Records show that life in the Almshouses was not very comfortable with open smoking fires in each room, no indoor water supply and a toilet block at the bottom of the garden. By the nineteenth century, discipline was also harsh with instant removal from the Almshouses being the punishment for any drunkenness or disobedience - a list of rules was displayed in each almshouse room. Life in the Almshouses continued to be very basic until the 1960s when major refurbishment improved the

accommodation and gave residents more space by reducing the number from 6 to 4.

Then again in the 1990s the interior was redesigned to make comfortable accommodation suitable for just 2 residents,

whilst retaining a beautiful 18th century exterior.

Since the Almshouses were built, Trustees have always worked hard to ensure that Frances Geering's charity continued to support the needs of the village community and in 1893 combined with several other smaller village charities.

afterwards known as the Harwell Parochial Charities. In earlier days the duties of a Trustee involved looking after the fabric of the building, appointing new residents, looking after their welfare and also administering charity to villagers in need.

In the 21st century 8 Trustees and a Clerk continue to have a role, but the duties have evolved and now include responsibility for maintaining a Grade 2 listed building, appointing residents and caring for their wellbeing, and working with the Charity Commission to ensure that the charity complies with required standards in managing a budget, risk assessment, and keeping the charity viable. Trustees are appointed for a 4 year period, and can with the approval of the other trustees, opt to carry on for further 4 year periods. We are an enthusiastic group and may have a vacancy for a new Trustee in the near future.
