

ELECTORAL ROLL REVISION 2018

The Electoral Rolls for St Matthew’s Harwell and All Saints’ Chilton are being revised in the period 1st March to 25th March inclusive. The Electoral Roll is your Parish Church’s Register of Electors, the list of those qualified to vote at the Church Annual General Meeting at which the Parochial Church Council and Deanery Synod representatives are elected. You need to be on the Electoral Roll for at least 6 months to be a PCC member or Churchwarden. If you are already on the Electoral Roll you do not need to re-register.

For St Matthew’s Harwell forms (form E2) may be obtained from the table at the back of church, and completed forms should be placed in the wall box near the main door. For All Saints’ Chilton forms may be obtained from Gordon Cowan (telephone 831932) or from All Saints’ Church (blank forms in the red envelope at the base of the font), and completed forms should be returned to Gordon or placed in the yellow envelope at the base of the font.

For both churches forms should be returned no later than Sunday, 25th March. Thank you.

FLEDGELINGS

At Fledgelings last week we finished our topic of Creation. We made some wonderful animal masks and learned in our "See & Know" time that on day 6 God made animals and people and on day 7 He rested (as we are doing this week during half term when there is no Fledgelings!).

The children also made Christingles and we thought about what each of the parts meant.



PARISH GIVING SCHEME

Lent is traditionally a time of almsgiving, and spring a time to review and refresh. As well as 'spring cleaning' our houses, it might be a good time to spring-clean our finances, too.

Last Sunday our church Treasurers, Stuart and Peter, reported on our annual accounts for 2017 and our budget for 2018. We also launched the 'Parish Giving Scheme' (PGS), which is a new way to organise regular, planned giving to All Saints' or St Matthew's.



The work of the church is only possible when supported through giving. We are grateful to all who give to church in so many ways, but the current focus is financial giving.

Planned giving especially helpful. It is also biblical: *"Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver"* (2 Cor 9:7).

Many give regularly by Standing Order or the envelope scheme and we are exceedingly grateful for that. We would like to encourage all to consider giving regularly, and for those who already have Standing Orders or use the envelopes, to consider using the new Parish Giving Scheme (PGS) that is being introduced today.

PGS is a national scheme, promoted and supported by the Diocese. It is a direct-debit based and significantly reduces the administration for our hard-working Treasurers and Bookkeepers, and improves cash flow.

It has the option to index link the amount given, so inflation-proofing your gift, can be used to give anonymously, and can be used for either general giving or for a particular purpose.

Flyers explaining more about the scheme are available, and if you would like to join, please take a form from the back of church, to either return or post.

Whether or not you already give regularly, please would you consider registering with PGS to support the work of the church? Thank you.
