RECTOR'S LETTER

"What do you do?" It's one of the first questions we tend to ask when we meet someone new. Often we have in mind what they are paid to do – their "job" or career – but 'what we do' is far more than that very narrow angle on someone's life. Most of us spend are far larger part of our lives doing things that we are not paid for, whether in our families, with our friends, or in our wider communities. We give our time freely to a myriad other activities that serve and enrich

going on – enormous in its impact, but often unseen and unacknowledged, whether it be the work of foodbanks, parenting support, Street Pastors, lunch clubs, debt support, youth clubs, and so on. This edition of the Broadsheet publicises the voluntary work of some of the groups and activities in our communities, but there is so much more that goes on; essential activity that enriches the lives of so many.

the lives of those around us and make us to be the people we really are. Our 'job' may give us a label – something that is relatively easy to lose or remove – it is the other stuff that marks us out in a more enduring way.

What we freely choose is an

expression of what is in our hearts. We give time and energy to individuals and causes for whom we care and about which we feel passionate. Love is a verb. Freely giving of ourselves is the essence of volunteering. 'Voluntas' is the will, and our volunteering is service that is freely given.

And it may be freely given, but that does not mean that it is not of value. The opposite is the case. People volunteer and serve as individuals and through a huge number of groups, but one recent study looking at time given by the UK Church and faith groups to their communities estimated the volunteering efforts each year to be worth £3 billion.

Such is the breadth and depth of commitment across the country, 60,000 faith groups in the UK were discovered to run 220,000 social action projects with almost 2 million volunteers and 125,000 paid staff, supporting 48 million people in need.

Of course not everything can be reduced to "pounds, shillings and pence", but the figures do give an indication of the scope of what is

INTERVIEW WITH MARGARET MCNIVEN

Margaret came to live in Harwell 49 years ago, in 1970 with her husband and young baby. Margaret really likes that there is so much going on in the village – much of it run by volunteers. Whatever you're interested in, you're likely to find a group in the village, or very close by. Margaret finds the village really friendly and sociable.

Margaret started volunteering for the special care unit at the John Radcliffe after her second son, James, was born and spent some time in the unit.

When her second son James was 6, Margaret set up the Harwell Beaver Scout Group in Harwell. They started with 12 boys over 30 years ago. We now have two Beaver groups in the village to

accommodate the number of children who want to attend. Margaret isn't helping regularly with any of the Scouting groups now, but she says that you never really leave Scouting. You'll still see Margaret with her Scouting uniform on for Church parades and special events such as Harwell Feast.

The highlight of Scouting for Margaret is going to camp and out on outings when you see the children for a bit longer and everyone is excited and there is a really good atmosphere.

Margaret can remember one day on camp when the walk didn't quite go according to plan. Margaret looked behind her to see how the children were getting on, and went over onto her ankle and broke it. It was agony! They were on a coastal path in Dorset, and due to the isolated location, Margaret went in a helicopter to the hospital. All the children thought it was wonderful and took lots of photographs and videos. Chris Stott (the former Rector) went into the helicopter



with Margaret and had a great time! Margaret was lying down and couldn't see much at all, however!

Margaret used to listen to children reading at Harwell School, and helped set up an After School Club at the school over 20 years ago.

For many years Margaret has been part of a

team of many who deliver the Ridgeway Broadsheet to their neighbours, so that we deliver to every home in Harwell and Chilton villages.

Margaret has been involved with Didcot First, which organises the annual food festival and events at Great Western Railway Centre.

More recently Margaret has helped at Harwell & Chilton Churches Holiday Club at

Harwell School and helping in crèche during Sunday morning services at St Matthew's. Although not a helper, Margaret often attends our church toddler group; Fledgelings, on a Monday morning at the Church Hall with her grandson Jack.

Margaret has been involved with St Matthew's Church for around 40 years. She didn't used to go to Church, and when her second son, James was baptised as a young child, Margaret was baptised at the same time.

Margaret is the one to beat when it comes to the competition for best decorated tent at Holiday Club! Last year, the door to the crèche room was beautifully decorated with reeds and a Moses basket.

With all this volunteering, Margaret really enjoys making good friends, which she says makes up for the fact that you don't get any financial gain. She loves being part of a Scouting and Church family.
