## THE FARMING COMMUNITY NETWORK

The Farming Community Network (FCN) is a voluntary organisation and charity which provides support for

farmers, farm workers and families through difficult times. 400 volunteers throughout England and Wales provide listening, support advocacy and signposting to those who need our help. We are in contact with about 6,000



people from the farming community each year; our volunteers travel

an average of 130,000 miles annually visiting farms to spend time with those who need us. As an organisation with a Christian ethos we help everyone who comes to us regardless of their faith; our volunteers are motivated by the command to love our neighbour. The second story of Genesis in the Bible pictures God creating the first humans from the soil and putting them in the

garden to till and care for the soil (Genesis 2). Farmers are the inheritors of that theological understanding of our origins and our link with and care for the land. The church holds agricultural festivals throughout the year – Plough, Rogation,

Lamas and especially Harvest mirroring the festivals of the Old Testament – to celebrate the work of farming, to pray for the land, to think about the responsibility each of us have for the creation.

Farming is a risky and volatile industry with farmers forced to deal with issues beyond their control such as fluctuating market prices, animal diseases, the weather – and farming can be a lonely and isolated occupation with long hours



present in the fields with little or no social interaction. There are pressures at the moment about the uncertainty of the future shape of

agriculture and trade agreements as we move towards leaving Europe.

In the last year farmers have sought help from FCN because of



financial issues, mental and physical well being concerns, family problems including worries about succession, animal diseases such as bovine TB and difficulties in relationships with policy makers and increasing demands on farming practices. The helpline which is staffed every day by volunteers between 7am and 11pm – 03000 111 999 – has been very busy indeed at times.

As well as working with farmers we also



liaise with a variety of stakeholders - vets, agricultural organisations, healthcare services - to provide information about the issues the farming community is facing. Together with other farming

help charities we raise awareness of issues of personal resilience and wellbeing with agricultural students, young farmers and others within the industry while others give talks to churches and other supporters of our work in rural communities.

## RECTOR'S LETTER

I write this on a warm September day, blue skies, sun shining. The last few days in the 20's Celsius, perhaps, before more autumnal weather is upon us.

We love to talk about the weather, don't we? Well, I do! It is said to be quintessentially English to talk with friends and stranger alike about the wind, rain, sun, snow, hail, or whatever it is that is coming to us from the heavens. The sheer unpredictability of it all makes for conversation. In some places, where the change from day to

day is minimal, there is little to comment on. But in England, where – it has been said – we do not have a climate, merely weather – we can celebrate or bewail our shared, varied experience.

Talking about the weather is a gentle way to start a conversation, and one I recommend if you're not sure what else to say, but feel you want or ought to strike up

conversation and break up an awkward silence or avoid having to pass another human on the road pretending they don't exist. The conversation may quickly peter out – "Lovely day", "Yes, isn't it?" – or it may lead on to deeper and potentially more interesting topics. But it is as good an opener as any, and arguably better than the alternative "How are you?" which is frequently asked without any real commitment to explore the depths of that profound query, and as often as not prompts that standard, "Fine, thanks. And you?" Talking about the weather is a safer bet for community relations than launching into a discussion about Brexit, and whilst both the weather and Brexit affect all of us, meteorological discourse is more of a social leveller. No amount of campaigning is going to affect the weather and it is not open to a people's vote; we get what we are given.

"He causes his sun to rise on the evil and the good, and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous" (Matthew 5:45)

> In drawing attention to this fact of nature, Jesus in his famous Sermon on the Mount is highlighting God's grace – his indiscriminate kindness that he shows to all, supplying our needs in accordance with his perfect knowledge and love. God knows what we need and provides for us, and not just bread for our physical needs, but the Bread of Life for our spiritual needs, too.

Jesus is the one who has come down from heaven, the gift of God provided freely for all, that we might have life – not just limited and earthly, but in all its fullness and eternally. He is the life-giving sunshine of God, piercing and transforming the stormy darkness of our world. Now that is quite some weather to talk about!


#### PASTORAL CARE
