"Please pass on our thanks on behalf of the clients of the Foodbank for the marvellous donation of food items that was brought in from Harwell School and Harwell and Chilton Churches. It was full of really useful items that are now ready to go out to the next people who come in; during September we issued food for 158 adults and children, and I expect we will do much the same again this month.
